Related Party Transaction Policy

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Bhansali Engineering Polymers Limited

1. PREAMBLE:

The Board of Directors (“the Board”) of Bhansali Engineering Polymers Limited (“the Company”) has adopted the following Policy for the Related Party Transactions (“RPTs”) pursuant to the provisions of Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Company, Sections 177, 188 and other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 (“the Act”) and Rules framed thereunder and Regulation 23 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as amended from time to time. The Audit Committee may from time to time review and recommend amendments to this policy to the Board. The Board may amend the policy from time to time. The said Policy includes the materiality threshold and the manner of dealing with Related Party Transactions (“RPT”).

2. DEFINITIONS:

“Audit Committee” or “Committee” means the committee constituted by the Board of Directors of the Company, from time to time, under the provisions of Regulation 18 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 and Section 177 of the Companies Act, 2013.

“Board of Director” or “Board” means the Board of Directors of Bhansali Engineering Polymers Limited as constituted from time to time.

“Company/ listed entity” means Bhansali Engineering Polymers Limited.

“Key Managerial Personnel” shall have the meaning ascribed to the term under Section 2(51) the Companies Act, 2013 and shall mean:

- (i) the Chief Executive Officer or the managing director or the manager;
- (ii) the company secretary;
- (iii) the whole-time director;
- (iv) the Chief Financial Officer;
- (v) such other officer, not more than one level below the directors who is in whole time employment, designated as key managerial personnel by the Board; and
- (vi) such other officer as may be prescribed under the Companies Act, 2013.

“Material Modification” means any modification to an existing Related Party Transaction which results in a change of more than 20% of the then approved transaction value.

“Material Related Party Transaction” means a transaction with a Related Party if the transaction / transactions to be entered into individually or taken together with

previous transactions during a financial year, exceeds Rs. 1000 Crore or ten percent of the annual consolidated turnover of the Company as per the last audited financial statements of the Company, whichever is lower.

Notwithstanding the above, a transaction involving payments made to a related party with respect to brand usage or royalty shall be considered material if the transaction(s) to be entered into individually or taken together with previous transactions during a financial year, exceed five percent of the annual consolidated turnover of the listed entity as per the last audited financial statements of the listed entity.

“Policy” means this policy on Related Party Transactions.

“Related Party” shall refer to an entity which is:

- (i) a related party as defined under Section 2(76) of the Companies Act, 2013; or
- (ii) a related party under the applicable accounting standards.

Provided that:

- a. any person or entity forming a part of the promoter or promoter group of the listed entity; or
- b. any person or any entity, holding equity shares:
 - (i) of twenty per cent or more; or
 - (ii) of ten per cent or more, with effect from April 1, 2023;

in the listed entity either directly or on a beneficial interest basis as provided under section 89 of the Companies Act, 2013, at any time, during the immediate preceding financial year, shall be deemed to be a related party.

The parties specified in Section 2(76) of the Companies Act, 2013 are as under:

- (i) a director or his relative;
- (ii) a key managerial personnel or his relative;
- (iii) a firm, in which a director, manager or his relative is a partner;
- (iv) a private company in which a director or manager or his relative is a member or director;
- (v) a public company in which a director or manager is a director and holds along with his relatives, more than two per cent of its paid-up share capital;
- (vi) any body corporate whose Board of Directors, managing director or manager is accustomed to act in accordance with the advice, directions or instructions of a director or manager;
- (vii) any person on whose advice, directions or instructions a director or manager is accustomed to act.

Provided that nothing in sub-clauses (vi) and (vii) shall apply to the advice, directions or instructions given in a professional capacity;

(viii) any company which is –

(A) a holding, subsidiary or an associate company of such company;

(B) a subsidiary of a holding company to which it is also a subsidiary; or

(C) an investing company or the venturer of a company;

Explanation: For the purpose of this clause, “the investing company or the venturer of a company” means a body corporate whose investment in the company would result in the company becoming an associate company of the body corporate.

(ix) such other person as may be prescribed.

“Related Party Transaction” means a transaction involving transfer of resources, services or obligations between:

(i) the listed entity or any of its subsidiaries on one hand and a Related Party of the listed entity or any of its subsidiaries on the other hand; or

(ii) a listed entity or any of its subsidiaries on one hand, and any other person or entity on the other hand, the purpose and effect of which is to benefit a related party of the listed entity or any of its subsidiaries, with effect from April 1, 2023; regardless of whether a price is charged.

“Transaction” with a related party shall be construed to include a single transaction or a group of transactions in a contract.

Provided that the following shall not be a related party transaction:

(a) the issue of specified securities on a preferential basis, subject to compliance of the requirements under the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue of Capital and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2018;

(b) the following corporate actions by the listed entity which are uniformly applicable/offered to all shareholders in proportion to their shareholding:

i. payment of dividend;

ii. sub division or consolidation of securities;

iii. issuance of securities by way of a rights issue or a bonus issue; and

iv. buy-back of securities

“Relative” means relative as defined under the Companies Act, 2013 and, with reference to any person, means anyone who is related to another, if –

i. they are members of a Hindu undivided family ;

ii. they are husband and wife; or

iii. Father (including step-father);

- iv. Mother (including step-mother);
- v. Son (including step-son);
- vi. Son's wife;
- vii. Daughter;
- viii. Daughter's husband;
- ix. Brother (including step-brother);
- x. Sister (including step-sister).

3. POLICY:

This Policy is framed to ensure the proper identification, approval, monitoring and reporting of transactions between the Company and their respective Related Parties.

All Related Party Transactions, including Material Related Party Transaction but excluding Exempted Transactions, will be placed before the Audit Committee for its review and prior approval in a meeting or by way of circular resolution.

Provided that only those members of the Audit Committee, who are independent directors, shall approve related party transactions.

Any member of the Committee who has a potential interest in any Related Party Transaction will recuse himself or herself and abstain from discussion and voting on the approval of the Related Party Transaction.

To review a Related Party Transaction, the Committee will be provided with all relevant material information of the Related Party Transaction, including the terms of the transaction, the business purpose of the transaction, the benefits/ loss to the Company, and any other relevant matters.

In determining whether to approve a Related Party Transaction, the Committee may consider all such factors/ or may call such information/ or seek external advice/ opinion as it may consider appropriate in its sole judgment.

4. CRITERIA FOR GRANTING OMNIBUS APPROVAL:

If the Committee determines that a Related Party Transaction should be brought before the Board, or if the Board in any case elects to review any such matter or it is mandatory under any law for Board to approve the Related Party Transaction, then the considerations set forth above shall apply to the Board's review and approval of the matter, with such modification as may be necessary.

All Related Party Transactions and subsequent material modification shall require prior approval of Audit Committee of the listed entity. However, the Audit committee may grant omnibus approval for related party transactions proposed to be entered into by the listed entity subject to the following conditions, namely-

- a. the audit committee shall lay down the criteria for granting the omnibus approval in line with the policy on related party transactions of the listed entity

and such approval shall be applicable in respect of transactions which are repetitive in nature;

- b. the audit committee shall satisfy itself regarding the need for such omnibus approval and that such approval is in the interest of the listed entity;
- c. the omnibus approval shall specify:
 - i. the name(s) of the related party, nature of transaction, period of transaction, maximum amount of transactions that shall be entered into,
 - ii. the indicative base price / current contracted price and the formula for variation in the price if any; and
 - iii. such other conditions as the audit committee may deem fit;

Provided that where the need for related party transaction cannot be seen and aforesaid details are not available, Audit Committee may grant omnibus approval for such transactions subject to their value not exceeding Rs.1 Crore per transaction.

- d. Audit Committee shall review, at least on a quarterly basis, the details of related party transactions entered into by the Company pursuant to each of the omnibus approval given.
- e. Such omnibus approvals shall be valid for a period not exceeding one year and shall require fresh approvals after the expiry of one year.

Further, all Material Related party transactions and subsequent Material Modifications thereto shall require prior approval of shareholders through resolution and no related parties shall vote to approve such resolution whether the entity is a related party to the particular transaction or not.

5. EXEMPTED TRANSACTIONS:

If the Committee determines that a Related Party Transaction should be brought before the Board, or if the Board in any case elects to review any such matter or it is mandatory under any law for Board to approve the Related Party Transaction, then the considerations set forth above shall apply to the Board's review and approval of such matter, with such modification as may be necessary or appropriate under the circumstances.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the following Related Party Transactions shall not require approval of Audit Committee or Shareholders:

- i. Any transaction that involves the providing of compensation or employment benefits to a director or Key Managerial Personnel in connection with his or her duties to the Company or any of its subsidiaries or associates, including the reimbursement of reasonable business and travel expenses incurred in the ordinary course of business.
- ii. Any transaction in which the Related Party's interest arises solely from ownership of securities issued by the Company and all holders of such

securities receive the same benefits pro rata as the Related Party (ies) (viz. without any discrimination).

6. CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING RELATED PARTY/ RELATED PARTY TRANSACTION(S):

Identification of Related Parties:

The Company Secretary, based on the declarations provided by the Directors and Key Managerial Personnel and also based on the corporate structure shall prepare a list of all persons who shall be considered as related parties with reference to the Company.

Identification of potential Related Party Transactions:

Each Director and Key Managerial Personnel is responsible for providing notice to the Board or Audit Committee of any potential Related Party Transaction involving him or her or his or her Relative, including any additional information about the transaction that the Board/Audit Committee may reasonably request. The Audit Committee would determine whether the transaction does, in fact, constitute a Related Party Transaction requiring compliance with this policy.

7. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS NOT APPROVED UNDER THIS POLICY:

In the event the Company becomes aware of a Related Party Transaction with a Related Party that has not been approved under this Policy, the matter shall be reviewed by the Committee. The Committee shall consider all of the relevant facts and circumstances regarding the Related Party Transaction, and shall evaluate all options available to the Company, including ratification, revision or termination of the Related Party Transaction.

In connection with any review of a Related Party Transaction, the Committee has authority to modify or waive any procedural requirements of this Policy.

This Policy will be communicated to all operational employees and other concerned persons of the Company.
